

DOCUMENTS NEEDED TO BENEFIT FROM THE CARICOM RIGHTS OF ESTABLISHMENT

CARICOM RIGHTS of ESTABLISHMENT

CARICOM Nationals have the right to establish a business in the CARICOM Single Market and Economy (CSME). This means Belizeans can establish a business in any of the other 12 CSME Member States: Antigua and Barbuda, Barbados, Dominica, Grenada, Guyana, Haiti, Jamaica, Saint Kitts and Nevis, Saint Lucia, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Suriname and Trinidad and Tobago. This is generally referred to as the Right of Establishment, which includes the following:

- The right to engage in any non-wage earning activity of a commercial, industrial, agricultural, professional, and artisinal nature; and
- The right to create and manage ecnonomic enterprises.





BUSINESS NAME REGISTRATION

The business name registration certificate or a certificate of incorporation for the economic enterprise the applicant intends to establish.

TAX IDENTIFICATION

Where applicable, the equivalent Bureau of Internal Revenue and General Sales Tax registration numbers, for the applicant, from the Caribbean Community State where the economic enterprise is registered.

SOCIAL SECURITY

Proof of registration with the Social Security Board of the Caribbean Community State where the enterprise will be established.

PROOF OF OWNERSHIP OF PROPERTY

Proof that the applicant is the title owner or the holder of a registered lease for the property the applicant intends to use for the business. Where applicable, written permission from the landlord or lessor to operate the economic enterprise from the premises.
